#### **Overview**

Blackpool FC Community Trust (BFCCT) is the official charity of Blackpool FC, based at Bloomfield Road Stadium. Working with residents as young as two years old up to adults in the later stages of life, Blackpool FC Community Trust provide a diverse range of programmes to increase social inclusion opportunities; improve physical fitness, health, and education; and lessen involvement in anti-social behaviour.

Many of the initiatives we deliver are directly funded through partner organisations and grant-awarding bodies. Some of these include The Premier League; the EFL Trust; The PFA; Sport England; Big Lottery; The Football Foundation; NHS Blackpool CCG and Blackpool Council to name a few. BFCCT constantly evolves to support local need and by linking with local partners we can increase our impact on the town.

Working with so many organisations has allowed us to become a vital strategic partner in activity provision across Blackpool and the Fylde Coast. In addition to the wealth of programmes out in the community and local schools, BFCCT provide several education opportunities on site. These include an alternative to main-stream schooling for Year 10 and 11 students; Traineeships for those not currently in work or education; as well as full-time education offers as part of Blackpool FC Sports College. Studying at Blackpool FC Sports College gives students the unique opportunity to learn within the largest sports organisation in Blackpool. This means students can speak to, and gain experience from, professionals currently working in the sport, fitness, and leisure sector.

In recent years, the Community Trust has grown into a well-established organisation, providing something for everybody, that every Blackpool FC fan and resident should be involved with and very proud of. Last season we were awarded with Community Club of the Season at the Northwest Football Awards as well being crowned Regional Community Club of the Season at the EFL Awards.

#### **Programme Overview**

The vision of Blackpool FC Community Trust is to continue to expand our offer of a full-time education within our Independent alternative provision School to support local secondary schools for pupils that want to maintain a full-time curriculum but struggle in the mainstream setting, however, show a keen interest in sport and physical activity. This vision is fully supported by local schools, as it clearly supports some of the most vulnerable youngsters in the town and fills a very significant gap in provision for the area- our attendance rate average of 90.8% shows how successful we have been at engaging, and sustaining meaningful relationships with our pupils, many of whom were at risk of exclusion from their mainstream setting and not attending regularly.

Our school is at Blackpool FC's Stadium on Bloomfield Road in a purpose-built facility, designated to the school, in the North Stand area of the Stadium. BFC School welcomes and caters for students aged 14-16 years of age who are experiencing challenges in mainstream education. During their time in our care, our team create individual and innovative learning programmes that are designed to inspire and re-engage each young person. This offer builds on the excellent experience BFCCT has already acquired in working on a shorter provision for students from various schools. The school takes a holistic approach to meeting each student's individual education, personal development and wellbeing needs.

All students in year 10 and 11 will work towards achieving Maths and English Language GCSE's, Maths and English Functional Skills (which can be achieved in their first year with us as a confidence boost and progression marker for individuals lacking in self-belief). All students will also study a Level 1 certificate in Sport in partnership with NCFE, our Awarding Body. As our vision and mission relates directly to building a more healthy and active community, we pride ourselves on delivering this qualification, and have recently passed our External Quality Assurance review giving us Direct Claims Status for this qualification.

As part of our sports programme, all Key Stage 4 students have opportunities to engage in a range of sporting activities both on and off-site. This year, students have participated in football coaching sessions on-site with BFCCT coaches in the Education and Community Centre activity hall, have engaged in aerobic and fitness sessions pitch-side in the stadium stands, and even trained in the gym located in the Blackpool Football Club Hotel, alongside first-team Blackpool Football Club players. On site in the activity hall pupils have also experienced rounders, cricket, dodgeball, personal fitness training, and delivered sessions to each other as part of their coaching and leading others modules.

Off-site, pupils have had weekly football training sessions and matches at Stanley Park, played basketball and badminton at Palatine Leisure Centre, organised and participated in a pool tournament at a local pool hall. We have also been attending weekly sessions at Brian Rose Boxing and Fitness Gym; where students received one-to-one training from the professional boxer himself, and have undertaken circuit training, tug-of-war team building, and sparred with each other. We also deliver the Duke of Edinburgh Award, giving students opportunities to learn valuable team building skills, improving health and fitness, improving the community, developing new skills and planning, training for and completing an expedition.

We at BFC School are extremely proud how far we have come in the last two years, and look forward to what the future holds.

#### **Job Purpose**

Blackpool FC Community Trust is the charitable arm of Blackpool FC, with a focus on engaging, developing, inspiring and supporting the people of Blackpool to live better lives.

Blackpool FC Community Trust is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children, young people and adults involved across all our programmes and expects all staff and volunteers to share this commitment. Blackpool FC Community trust was proud to open its independent school in September 2021 for Key stage 4 learners. The school is an alternative education setting to support learners who are either at risk of permanent exclusion or those who need support that cannot be provided in a mainstream setting, this includes behavioural issues, mental health and well-being concerns and students who love sport, in particular, football. We are seeking to appoint a committed, enthusiastic, and positive teacher who will deliver a range of vocational qualifications, including PSHE, RSE and practical Sport.

The candidate will play a pivotal role in inspiring students, supporting individual and group learning, and working collaboratively with our dedicated staff. If you are passionate about education, possess excellent interpersonal skills, and have a strong background in teaching, coaching and youth engagement, we encourage you to apply. The post holder will deliver aspects of the NCFE Sport and exercise curriculum as well as PSHE, RSE and 1-1 mentoring. The role involves curriculum planning, working effectively with the school team, managing progress of learners, monitoring of attendance and punctuality and enriching student experiences. The job holder will play a powerful and influential role in many young people's lives by promoting the Community Trust and its values.

#### Main Roles and Responsibilities

- Plan and deliver high quality theory and practical NCFE sports lessons to Key stage 4 students
- Support the effective delivery of all components of the PSHE and key skills curriculum, driving a high-quality standard of delivery throughout
- Produce and develop high quality teaching and learning materials using a variety of methods
- Work closely with the education team to ensure a joined-up approach in both planning and delivery across the school.
- Support other colleagues and learners across the school with pastoral matters and provide 1-1 support when needed
- Be responsible for maintaining a positive and safe learning environment with regards to health and safety, professional standards, appearance, and display.
- Take part in regular formative assessment which enables all students to improve and complete progress checks and reports as required.
- Report on learner's progress on a regular basis (6-week reviews).
- Communicate with parents re student's progress, attitude to learnings, punctuality, and attendance.
