Blackpool FC Community Trust (BFCCT) is the official charity of Blackpool FC, based at Bloomfield Road Stadium. Working with residents as young as two years old up to adults in the later stages of life, Blackpool FC Community Trust provide a diverse range of programmes to increase social inclusion opportunities; improve physical fitness, health, and education; and lessen involvement in anti-social behaviour.

Many of the initiatives we deliver are directly funded through partner organisations and grant-awarding bodies. Some of these include The Premier League; the EFL Trust; The PFA; Sport England; Big Lottery; The Football Foundation; NHS Blackpool CCG and Blackpool Council to name a few. BFCCT constantly evolves to support local need and by linking with local partners we can increase our impact on the town.

Working with so many organisations has allowed us to become a vital strategic partner in activity provision across Blackpool and the Fylde Coast. In addition to the wealth of programmes out in the community and local schools, BFCCT provide several education opportunities on site. These include an alternative to main-stream schooling for Year 10 and 11 students; Traineeships for those not currently in work or education; as well as full-time education offers as part of Blackpool FC Sports College. Studying at Blackpool FC Sports College gives students the unique opportunity to learn within the largest sports organisation in Blackpool. This means students can speak to, and gain experience from, professionals currently working in the sport, fitness, and leisure sector.

In recent years, the Community Trust has grown into a well-established organisation, providing something for everybody, that every Blackpool FC fan and resident should be involved with and very proud of. Last season we were awarded with Community Club of the Season at the Northwest Football Awards as well being crowned Regional Community Club of the Season at the EFL Awards.

Our Premier League Primary Stars programme is offered to all Blackpool primary schools. The programme aims to support primary school teachers to improve their knowledge, confidence and delivery of national curriculum PE lessons as well as increasing the attainment levels of pupils within Maths and English.

The Premier League Primary Stars website is available to all teachers across the country, providing them with free teaching resources across P.E., PSHE, English and Maths. Registration to the website is free too!

Fit2Go

Fit2Go is currently being delivered to every primary school in Blackpool. Year 4 pupils are receiving a programme of increased physical activity and health education that can include:

- Healthy lifestyle classroom based sessions
- Physical activity sessions organised around the school day
- Extracurricular sessions after school
- Family health workshops
- Fit2Go celebration festivals and quizzes at Bloomfield Road
- Player appearances and Blackpool FC goody giveaways

An interactive workbook has been produced to follow the six week programme and support the classroom sessions.

Fit2Go is being delivered as part of Altogether Now – a legacy for Blackpool, the multipartnership programme between the NHS in Blackpool (Clinical Commissioning Group and Teaching Hospitals Foundation Trust), Blackpool Football Club and Blackpool Council.

Unstoppable

Pupils read up to certain points each week and are then led through a classroom session by one of our Health & Wellbeing Officers, discussing these hard hitting topics. The use of literature to facilitate child led PSHE discussion is a relatively new concept, however, has been extremely well received within the schools.

The children will then get to keep the book and workbooks they develop through their involvement, to refer back to when they are challenged in their daily lives.

Job Purpose

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In recent years the Trust has grown significantly and has become an established organisation, providing something for everybody, that every Blackpool FC fan and resident should be involved in and very proud of.

Blackpool FC Community Trust has a very exciting opportunity for someone to join the very successful Health and Wellbeing team, working on our healthy lifestyle programmes and mental health provisions with a focus on reducing anti-social behaviour and increasing awareness to the harm it causes the community. Delivered in local primary schools and nurseries and supporting families in the community. The post holder will also support with delivery on our multi-sports camps.

Blackpool FC Community Trust, based at Bloomfield Road Stadium, have delivered the Fit2Go project in local primary schools for more than ten years, in partnership with Public Health Blackpool and Blackpool NHS Clinical Commissioning Group. The project focuses on making year 4 pupils aware of the importance of eating well, taking part in regular exercise and the effect it has our lifestyle.

Unstoppable is our year 6 PSHE programme, using the novel of the same name written by Dan Freedman. It aims to equip young people with decision making skills around ASB, relationships, gang culture, knife crime, friendships, emotional wellbeing and transition. The successful post holder will be part of the Health and Wellbeing delivery team, taking classroom-based sessions, which are followed up with a physical activity session, focused around the school PE curriculum. The successful candidate will help delivery educational interventions that span PSHE, with a focus on Maths and English. The post holder will also deliver community-based family programmes, with the same intentions, but focused on the whole household and the adjustments that can be made to the full families' health and wellbeing. The post holder will also be required to deliver on our multi-sports camps during school holidays, helping children to engage in games and physical activity.

The successful candidate will have excellent communication skills, whilst having a good understanding and experience of delivering healthy lifestyle provision. This individual will also have the relevant experience and qualifications to deliver physical activity and PE sessions within local primary schools and the wider community.

Main Roles and Responsibilities

- Working within Blackpool FC Community Trust's Health and Wellbeing team, delivering high quality health related classroom, PE and sport sessions in local primary schools, with a range of participants and classes.
- Deliver high quality PSHE provision with a focus and reducing Anti-Social Behaviour within primary schools, with a range of participants and classes.
- Support local families in developing their understanding of how to live a healthy lifestyle.
- To co-ordinate and deliver festivals/events throughout the school year.
- To co-deliver school holiday sports camps.
- To analyse feedback received from providers under specialised projects provision to ensure programmes are effectively delivered.
- To perform other duties as reasonably assigned or under the authority of the senior management team
- To work first team home matches when required, evenings and weekends
- To build and maintain relationships with local schools, grassroots football teams and partners to deliver quality programmes.
